#### SPECIAL ALLOCATIONS - CRITERIA

ASUWT advocates for the UW Tacoma student body to enhance the Husky experience for all. The Board of Directors and Senators bring a unified voice to campus administration, Tri-Campus representation, and state-level government. We bridge the gap between campus leadership and faculty to ensure that students have a voice in matters that impact them. A new way these funds will benefit students next year is through the addition of the Director of Student Advocacy & Diversity. ### STUDENT UTILIZATION

Wages request includes adjustment for the new 2022 WA State minimum wage of \$14.49 - 30 cent differential. Due to the UWT Climate survey, Diversity/ Equity/ Inclusion, and Covid recovery, the President of ASUWT, in conjunction with the Chancellor, has launched student led Task Forces to address these issues. Each Task Force will champion, in partnership with the administration, the above stipulated student issues and concerns.

The increased weekly hours for the select Executive Board Directors will allow each of them to lead these Task Forces. The Director of Legislative Affairs will using these additional weekly hours to pursue an integrated legislative agenda with his team for ASUWT in partnership with ASUW, ASUWB, and WSA.


