

After Selecting your program there will be a list of requirements to complete in order to participate in a program, generally these will include:

- 1) A brief statement of why you would be a good fit for the program
- 2) A professor recommendation
- 3) Academic Information

It is generally recommended to apply to at least two programs just in case you do not get accepted

Deciding on a Program

- 1) Check the requirements of each program, some programs will only let certain majors join

- 3) Costs, make a budget sheet beforehand
